The Mountains are Calling - Next Stop Knoxville!



It's time to make your summer vacation plans! This year's LOTS convention takes us to **Knoxville, Tennessee** - **Home of the Vols!** From July 9 to 16, 2023, you'll enjoy six days of tours in or near the third largest city in Tennessee.

Knoxville is located in the Great Appalachian Valley, known locally as the Tennessee Valley, about halfway between the Great Smoky Mountains to the east, and the Cumberland Plateau to the west, and is within a day's drive of more than half the entire membership in LOTS!

Knoxville was settled in 1786 and was the first capital of Tennessee. Knoxville is also the home of the flagship campus of the University of Tennessee and the Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA), a federally owned electric utility corporation created by Congress in 1933.

The first railroads to arrive in Knoxville were the East Tennessee & Georgia Railroad (1855) and the East Tennessee & Virginia Railroad (1856.) With these railroads and the river, Knoxville became a major transportation hub and commercial center for East Tennessee. Knoxville grew rapidly as a major wholesaling and manufacturing center.

What's that golf tee with a gold ball on top of it in the LOTS convention logo? It's the Sunsphere, a one-of-a-kind structure built for the 1982 World's Fair that was held in downtown Knoxville. Those who sign up for our Tuesday tour will be whisked up to the 4th floor for an outstanding view! Sign up today!



On Saturday, July 15, we'll share and promote toy trains by hosting the **Knoxville Airport Model Train Show.** The show features all types of trains in one of the Hilton Knoxville Airport Hotel ballrooms.

Tour #1: Great Smoky Mountain Heritage Center, Little River Railroad and Lumber Company Museum, and Tuckaleechee Caverns

Monday, July 10 - Time: 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Adults: \$92.00, Children: \$65.00

To kick off our 44th Annual Convention, we'll head out early to Townsend, Tennessee, the Peaceful Side of the Smokies.

Stop #1 - Great Smoky Mountains Heritage Center - The Great Smoky Mountains Heritage Center features two galleries displaying Native American and early settler artifacts dating from 10,000 BC to the 1930s. On display are items related to the five national parks in East Tennessee. As we stroll through the pioneer village of original 19th-century buildings and the transportation barn that chronicles



transportation from horse-drawn buggies to motorized vehicles, we'll get a sense of the spirit and history of Townsend, Cades Cove, and the Great Smoky Mountains.

Stop # 2: The Abbey Restaurant - Lunch will be catered by The Abbey Restaurant and Tap House on the banks of the Little River. Lunch choices are a pork BBQ sandwich, chicken salad croissant or soup and salad. Please be sure to make your lunch selection when you register.

Stop #3: Little River Railroad and Lumber Company Museum - Walking distance from The Abbey Restaurant is the Little River Railroad and

Lumber Company Museum. During our visit, we'll learn about steam logging in the Smokies from 1901 to 1938. A Shay engine that had been used in the logging operation, No. 2147, was restored



and is on display along with some other interesting equipment and a small G-gauge railroad. In 1983, the depot building, from Walland, Tennessee, was moved to Townsend and is currently used to display the memorabilia that was collected from the days of the railroad and lumber operations.

Stop #4: Tuckaleechee Caverns - Tuckaleechee Caverns - Known as the "Greatest Site Under the Smokies" are the highest-rated Cave or Cavern of the Eastern United States. Carved inside the earth's oldest mountain chain and estimated to be between

twenty and thirty million years old, the Caverns are rich in history and lore, in recent years as well. Millions of formations



are viewed along the 1.25 mile round-trip adventure. You will find the "Big Room" on one end of the tour that could almost fit a football stadium inside it. On the other half of the tour you get to view "Silver Falls". Silver Falls (210 feet from top to bottom) is the tallest subterranean waterfall in the Eastern United States. In addition, Tuckaleechee Caverns hosts the most sensitive seismic station on Earth. The station is now monitored 24-7 and is able to detect nuclear testing across the globe. Note: Please wear comfortable walking shoes and a light jacket! The Caverns have stairs and walkways with handrails, but may not be suitable for those with extreme mobility challenges. Travel time to Townsend is 45 minutes from the hotel.

Tour #2: Tennessee Riverboat Cruise, The Foundry on the Fair Site, World's Fair Park, Sunsphere, L&N and Southern Passenger Stations

Tuesday, July 11 - Time: 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Adults: \$95.00, Children: \$65.00

Today's tour takes us to the city of Knoxville, Tennessee approximately 25 minutes from the hotel.

Stop #1 - Tennessee Riverboat Company - Our adventure will begin with a relaxing cruise on board the Star of Knoxville paddle-wheel riverboat on the scenic Tennessee River. The Tennessee River is one of the most beautiful rivers you will ever cruise. While



cruising, you will enjoy one of the most breathtaking views in Knoxville. Narration will be provided during the 1.5-hour cruise.

Stop #2 - The

Foundry on the Fair Site - Built in 1865, The Foundry on the Fair Site was originally operated as a foundry for the casting of railroad spikes and flathead nails from cannonballs. The building fell into disuse, burned, and was later renovated to host the Strohaus (German Pavilion) throughout the 1982 World's Fair. Lunch will be served in one of The Foundry's ballrooms and will feature your choice of grilled

chicken, beef stroganoff or a salad of mixed greens with a blend of grains.

Stop #2 - L&N Passenger Station - Across the street from The Foundry and on our way to the famous Knoxville Sunsphere, is Knoxville's L&N



Station. It is unlikely that we will be able to enter the station since it is currently part of Knox County Schools. However, we will still be able to gaze at the restored stained glass windows from the outside.


Stop #3 - The Sunsphere - Built for the 1982 World's Fair, the Sunsphere is a one-of-a-kind structure. The 4th Floor Observation Deck offers a breathtaking 360-degree view stretching from downtown to the Great Smoky Mountains including World's Fair Park, the Tennessee River, and the University of Tennessee Campus.

Stop #3 - Southern Railway's Passenger Station - In addition to browsing through the station, we'll walk thru the restored private passenger cars, one of which was a former "Jim Crow" service car and another the famous Railway Post Office (RPO) car.

Tour #3: Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum's Hiwassee River Rail Excursion

Wednesday, July 12 - Time: 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Adults: \$105.00, Children: \$75.00

Today's train excursion takes us south to Copperhill, Tennessee and McCaysville, GA where you can have one foot in Tennessee and one foot in Georgia at one time! To get there, we'll travel a little



an hour by motorcoach to Delano, Tennessee where we'll board the Tennessee Valley Railroad Museum's Hiwassee River Rail Excursion train. We'll travel about 50 miles on trackage that was formerly part of the Louisville and Nashville (L&N) Railroad's Atlanta Division stretching between Etowah, Tennessee and Marietta, Georgia. Attendees will enjoy fantastic river views as we make our way to the famous Hiwassee Loop. The "Loop" is almost two miles in length. The change in vertical elevation is 426 feet. The trestle where the line crosses over itself is 197 feet long and 63 feet high. Don't forget to bring your camera!

After we traverse the "Loop," we'll continue south to Copperhill, Tennessee. There will be ample time to shop and enjoy lunch on your own in town. After lunch and shopping, we will travel by motorcoach and stop at the L&N Depot and Railway Museum in Etowah, Tennessee, before returning to the hotel.

Tour #4: Brushy Mountain Penitentiary and Distillery, Manhattan Project Museums, and Knoxville Area Model Railroaders

Thursday, July 13 - Time: 8:00 a.m. – 6:15 p.m. Adults: \$110.00, Children: \$70.00

Put on your walking shoes and travel back in time moonshine tasting if you like! The following stops are included in today's tour:

Stop #1 - Brushy Mountain State Penitentiary -Brushy Mountain State Penitentiary was the last

place you wanted to be sent! Known as the "End of the Line," Brushy was a maximum security prison that held Tennessee's worst of the worst! Today, the historic site is home to prison tours, Brushy Mountain Distillery and Warden's Table Restaurant and more. Prior to eating lunch,




we'll tour the prison and have the opportunity to sample some moonshine.

Stop #2 - The Oak Ridge History Museum - The Oak Ridge History Museum shines a light on the "human side" of the Manhattan Project, focusing on history and people's day-to-day lives during World War II in Oak Ridge. Various artifacts from public and private collections are on display including the largest collection of original Ed Westcott photography. Ed was the official photographer for the Manhattan Project approved by the United States government.

Stop #3 - Knoxville Area Model Railroaders -Inspired by models donated by longtime Oak Ridge model railroader Milton Lloyd and built by members of the Knoxville Area Model Railroaders (KAMR), the

Children's Museum of Oak Ridge features a World of Trains display with a mock-up of a diesel engine and a large HO scale layout called Lloydstown. In addition, this section of the museum contains the meeting rooms of KAMR, a full-size Norfolk Southern caboose, and a garden railroad. The KAMR have layouts in all gauges and are excited to share their private club area with LOTS members.

Stop #4 - K-25 History Center - The 7,500 square foot K-25 History Center honors the amazing stories of the men and women who helped construct and operate the K-25 uranium enrichment complex. The uranium that was produced using the gaseous diffusion process, fueled one of two atomic bombs that ended World War II.



Tour #5: Chandler Farms Steam Train and the Crofut & Iron Creek Railroad

Friday, July 14 - Time: 8:30 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. Adults: \$72.00, Children: \$50.00



Dirk and April Chandler are looking forward to sharing Chandler Farms with LOTS members on the fifth day of touring during the LOTS 44th Annual Convention. Chandler Farms is a private collection of railroad, farming, and steam equipment in East Tennessee. Notable pieces include a Plymouth locomotive operating on a loop of former Knoxville, Sevierville, and Eastern (Smoky Mountain Railroad) rails, a steam roller, a fully-functional steam belt-driven workshop, and a 7.5" gauge live steam railroad. The Chandlers have a passion for preserving

equipment from the past for future generations. Chandler Farms is accessible only by private invitation. Before departing you'll enjoy a boxed lunch and some fresh ice cream made from a steam powered ice cream maker. This tour has limited tickets available, register early so you don't get left at the station!

Prior to returning to the hotel, we'll stop at Iron Creek Shops and the Crofut & Iron Creek Railroad. Don Niday, a pioneer in "F scale," looks forward to sharing his layout and shop with LOTS members. F-Scale: In North America, most garden railways run on #1 gauge tracks (45mm between rails). In spite of the wide variety of prototypes and scales found within these "large scale" trains, they share one thing in common: they all run on #1 gauge tracks.



Gauge and scale are actually very different concepts. Scale refers to the proportional relationship between a model and its prototype. In contrast, gauge refers to the distance between the two rails on which our model trains run. A model train built to a specific scale should also run on a model track gauge proportional to the prototype.

As garden railroading has evolved, this has not been the case historically. Scale has generally been sacrificed for the expediency of one virtually universal track gauge - 45mm - resulting in a cacophony of scales and mismatched models, all trundling down the same track under the vague label of "G-scale."

Unlike the smaller model railroading scales, where each major scale has its own standard gauge as well as narrow gauge counterparts (for example: O, On3, On30; or H0, and H0n3) and uses a variety of proportional track gauges, large scale hasn't had this option before. An accurate narrow gauge model is best complemented by an accurate standard gauge model.

With F-scale, you can now accurately model narrow and standard gauge trains in the same scale by creating a new track gauge of 70.64mm (2.781"). Sign up for Tour #5 to learn more about the newest scale recognized by the NMRA.
